## Saul - The Bounty Hunter - Acts 26A

Summarized the mock court system Paul has and will go through. Acts 16 Summarized of Paul praising God in prison.

Philippians 4:13 <u>I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me</u>. Acts 26:1-11 Then Agrippa said unto Paul, Thou art permitted to speak for

thyself. Then Paul stretched forth the hand, and answered for himself: 2 I think myself happy, king Agrippa, because I shall answer for myself this day before thee touching all the things whereof I am accused of the Jews: 3 Especially because I know thee to be expert in all customs and questions which are among the Jews: wherefore I beseech thee to hear me patiently. 4 My manner of life from my youth, which was at the first among mine own nation at Jerusalem, know all the Jews; 5 Which knew me from the beginning, if they would testify, that after the most straitest sect of our religion I lived a Pharisee. 6 And now I stand and am judged for the hope of the promise made of God unto our fathers: 7 Unto which promise our twelve tribes, instantly serving God day and night, hope to come. For which hope's sake, king Agrippa, I am accused of the Jews. 8 Why should it be thought a thing incredible with you, that God should raise the dead? 9 I verily thought with myself, that I ought to do many things contrary to the name of Jesus of Nazareth. 10 Which thing I also did in Jerusalem: and many of the saints did I shut up in prison, having received authority from the chief priests; and when they were put to death, I gave my voice against them. 11 And I punished them oft in every synagogue, and compelled them to blaspheme; and being exceedingly mad against them, I persecuted them even unto strange cities.

Acts 26:1 Then Agrippa said unto Paul, Thou art permitted to speak for thyself. Then Paul stretched forth the hand, and answered for himself:

Acts 25:11,25,26 For if I be an offender, or have committed any thing worthy of death, I refuse not to die: but if there be none of these things whereof these accuse me, no man may deliver me unto them. I appeal unto Caesar. 25 But when I found that he had committed nothing worthy of death, and that he himself hath appealed to Augustus, I have determined to send him. 26 Of whom I have no certain thing to write unto my lord. Wherefore I have brought him forth before you, and specially before thee, O king Agrippa, that, after examination had, I

- might have somewhat to write.
- Strongs #3107 makarios *mak-ar'-ee-os* AV-blessed 44, happy 5, happier 1; 50 1) blessed, happy (Mostly used as blessed.)
- Matthew 5 the Beatitudes referred to where Blessed is used, but modern translations use Happy.
- Acts 26:2-5 I think myself happy (blessed), king Agrippa, because I shall answer for myself this day before thee touching all the things whereof I am accused of the Jews: 3 Especially because I know thee to be expert in all customs and questions which are among the Jews: wherefore I beseech (beg) thee to hear me patiently. 4 My manner of life from my youth, which was at the first among mine own nation at Jerusalem, know all the Jews; 5 Which knew me from the beginning, if they would testify, that after the most straitest (strictest) sect of our religion I lived a Pharisee.
- Acts 22:3 I am verily a man *which am* a Jew, born in Tarsus, *a city* in Cilicia, yet brought up in this city at the feet of <u>Gamaliel</u>, *and* taught according to the perfect manner of the law of the fathers, and was zealous toward God, as ye all are this day.
- Matthew 15:8 This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with *their* lips; but their <u>heart</u> is <u>far from</u> me.
- Strongs #4569 Saulos sow'-los AV-Saul 17 Saul =" desired" 1) the Jewish name of the apostle Paul
- Strongs #07586 Sha'uwl *shaw-ool'* AV-Saul 399, Shaul 7; 406 Saul or Shaul =" desired"
- 1) a Benjamite, son of Kish, and the 1st king of Israel
- 2) an early king of Edom and a successor of Samlah
- 3) a son of Simeon 4) a Levite, son of Uzziah
- Strongs #3972 Paulos *pow'-los* AV-Paul 163, Paulus (the deputy) 1; 164 Paul or Paulus =" small or little"
- 1) Paul was the most famous of the apostles and wrote a good part of the NT, the 14 Pauline epistles
- 2) Paulus was a deputy or pro-consul of Cyprus and is said to be a prudent man, in the management of affairs, as a governor
- 1 Samuel 9:2 And he had a son, whose name was <u>Saul</u>, a choice young man, and a goodly: and *there was* not among the children of Israel a goodlier person than he: from his <u>shoulders</u> and upward *he was* higher than any of the people.
- Acts 26:6-8 And now I stand and am judged for the hope of the promise

- made of God unto our fathers: 7 Unto which promise our twelve tribes, instantly (earnestly) serving God day and night, hope to come. For which hope's sake, king Agrippa, I am accused of the Jews. 8 Why should it be thought a thing incredible with you, that God should raise the dead?
- John 7 Lazarus raised summarized V43 And when he thus had spoken, he cried with a loud voice, Lazarus, come forth.
- Acts 17: Summarized Paul preaching at Athens. V32 And when they heard of the resurrection of the dead, some mocked: and others said, We will hear thee again of this *matter*.
- Acts 26:9,10 Indeed, I myself thought I must do many things contrary to the name of Jesus of Nazareth. 10 This I also did in Jerusalem, and many of the saints I shut up in prison, having <u>received authority from the chief priests</u>; and <u>when they were put to death</u>, I cast my vote against them.
- Acts 22:20 And when the blood of thy martyr Stephen was shed, I also was standing by, and consenting unto his death, and kept the raiment of them that slew him.
- John 10:10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have *it* more abundantly.
- 1 Peter 5:8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your <u>adversary</u> the <u>devil</u>, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:
- Acts 26:11 And I punished them often in every synagogue and compelled *them* to blaspheme; and being exceedingly enraged (mad, temporary insanity) against them, I persecuted *them* even to foreign cities.
- Luke 10:19 Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you.
- Mark 12:14,17 And when they were come, they say unto him, Master, we know that thou art true, and carest for no man: for thou regardest not the person of men, but teachest the way of <u>God</u> in truth: Is it lawful to give tribute to <u>Caesar</u>, or not? 17 And Jesus answering said unto them, Render to <u>Caesar</u> the things that are <u>Caesar</u>'s, and to <u>God</u> the things that are God's. And they marvelled at him.
- Summarized Religious leaders questioning Jesus to trap Him.
- Matthew 22:29-32 Jesus answered and said unto them, <u>Ye do err, not knowing the scriptures, nor the power of God</u>. 30 For <u>in the resurrection</u> they neither marry, nor are given in marriage, but are as the angels of

- God in heaven. 31 But as touching the resurrection of the dead, have ye not read that which was spoken unto you by God, saying, 32 I am the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob? God is not the God of the dead, but of the living.
- 1 John 4:3 And every <u>spirit</u> that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that <u>spirit</u> of <u>antichrist</u>, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world.
- Mark 2:17 When Jesus heard *it*, he saith unto them, They that are whole have no need of the <u>physician</u>, but they that are sick: I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.
- Summarized many miracles of Elisha & 2 Kings 6 in Dothan.
- Luke 1:37 For with God nothing shall be impossible.
- Luke 18:27 And he said, The things which are impossible with men are possible with God.
- Summarized many miracles done by Jesus.
- John 5:25-29 Verily, verily, I say unto you, The hour is coming, and now is, when the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God: and they that hear shall live. 26 For as the Father hath life in himself; so hath he given to the Son to have life in himself; 27 And hath given him authority to execute judgment also, because he is the Son of man. 28 Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear his voice, 29 And shall come forth; they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; and they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation.
- Hebrews 9:27 And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:
- Job 19:26,27 And *though* after my skin *worms* destroy this *body*, <u>yet in my flesh shall I see God</u>: 27 Whom I shall see for myself, and mine eyes shall behold, and not another; *though* my reins (kidneys, inner parts) be consumed within me.
- Isaiah 26:19 Thy <u>dead men shall live</u>, <u>together with</u> my dead body <u>shall they</u> <u>arise</u>. Awake and sing, ye that dwell in dust: for thy dew *is as* the dew of herbs, and <u>the earth shall cast out the dead</u>.
- Daniel 12:2 <u>And many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall</u> awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame *and* everlasting contempt.
- 1 Corinthians 15 referred to chapter on the Ressurection from the dead. Acts 9 Summarized V3-6 And as he journeyed, he came near Damascus:

and suddenly there shined round about him a light from heaven: 4 And he fell to the earth, and heard a voice saying unto him, Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me? 5 And he said, Who art thou, Lord? And the Lord said, I am Jesus whom thou persecutest: *it is* hard for thee to kick against the pricks. 6 And he trembling and astonished said, Lord, what wilt thou have me to do? And the Lord *said* unto him, Arise, and go into the city, and it shall be told thee what thou must do.

- John 16:2 They shall put you out of the synagogues: yea, the time cometh, that whosoever killeth you will think that he <u>doeth God</u> <u>service</u>.
- Acts 27:10 And said unto them, Sirs, I perceive that this voyage will be with hurt and much damage, not only of the lading and ship, but also of our lives.

Summarized the situation of the ship through the storm.

- Acts 27:22-24 And now I exhort you to be of good cheer: for there shall be no loss of *any man's* life among you, but of the ship. 23 For there stood by me this night the angel of God, whose I am, and whom I serve, 24 Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: and, Io, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee.
- 1 Samuel 23:25 <u>Saul</u> also and his men went to seek *him*. And they told <u>David</u>: wherefore he came down into a rock, and abode in the wilderness of Maon. And when <u>Saul</u> heard *that*, he <u>pursued</u> after <u>David</u> in the wilderness of Maon.
- 1 Samuel 23:28 Wherefore <u>Saul</u> returned from <u>pursuing</u> after <u>David</u>, and went against the Philistines: therefore they called that place Selahammahlekoth.
