Rescued From Disaster - Acts 28A

Summarized Paul going safely through the storm.

- Acts 27:20 And when neither sun nor stars in many days appeared, and no small tempest lay on *us*, all hope that we should be saved was then taken away.
- Acts 27:24 Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee.
- Acts 28:1-10 And when they were escaped, then they knew that the island was called Melita. 2 And the barbarous people shewed us no little kindness: for they kindled a fire, and received us every one, because of the present rain, and because of the cold. 3 And when Paul had gathered a bundle of sticks, and laid them on the fire, there came a viper out of the heat, and fastened on his hand. 4 And when the barbarians saw the venomous beast hang on his hand, they said among themselves, No doubt this man is a murderer, whom, though he hath escaped the sea, yet vengeance suffereth not to live. 5 And he shook off the beast into the fire, and felt no harm. 6 Howbeit they looked when he should have swollen, or fallen down dead suddenly: but after they had looked a great while, and saw no harm come to him, they changed their minds, and said that he was a god. 7 In the same quarters were possessions of the chief man of the island, whose name was Publius; who received us, and lodged us three days courteously. 8 And it came to pass, that the father of Publius lay sick of a fever and of a bloody flux: to whom Paul entered in, and prayed, and laid his hands on him, and healed him. 9 So when this was done, others also, which had diseases in the island, came, and were healed: 10 Who also honoured us with many honours; and when we departed, they laded us with such things as were necessary.
- Hebrews 1:14 Are they (God's angels) not all <u>ministering spirits</u>, sent forth to minister for them who shall be heirs of salvation?

- Acts 28:1-3 (NKJV) Now when they had escaped, they then found out that the island was called Malta. 2 And the natives showed us unusual kindness; for they kindled a fire and made us all welcome, because of the rain that was falling and because of the cold. 3 But when Paul had gathered a bundle of sticks and laid them on the fire, a viper came out

- because of the heat, and fastened on his hand.
- 2 Thessalonians 3:8 Neither did we eat any <u>man</u>'s bread for nought; but wrought with labour and travail night and day, that we might not be <u>chargeable</u> to any of you:
- Ephesians 4:28 Let him that stole steal no more: but rather let him labour, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have to give to him that needeth.
- Colossians 3:23 And <u>whatsoever</u> ye <u>do</u>, <u>do</u> *it* heartily, as to the <u>Lord</u>, and not unto men;
- John 8:36 If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed.
- Acts 28:4 So when the natives saw the creature hanging from his hand, they said to one another, "No doubt this man is a murderer, whom, though he has escaped the sea, yet justice does not allow to live."
- 2 Corinthians 10:5 Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;
- Matthew 7:13,14 Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide *is* the gate, and broad *is* the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: 14 Because strait *is* the gate, and <u>narrow</u> *is* the <u>way</u>, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.
- Acts 28:5 But he shook off the creature into the fire and suffered no harm. Mark 16:17,18 And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils: they shall speak with new tongues: 18 They
- shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; 18 They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover.
- Luke 4:9-12 And he brought him to Jerusalem, and set him on a pinnacle of the temple, and said unto him, If thou be the Son of God, cast thyself down from hence: 10 For it is written, He shall give his angels charge over thee, to keep thee: 11 And in *their* hands they shall bear thee up, lest at any time thou dash thy foot against a stone. 12 And Jesus answering said unto him, It is said, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God.
- Acts 28:6 However, they were expecting that he would swell up or suddenly fall down dead. But after they had looked for a long time and saw no harm come to him, they changed their minds and said that he was a god.
- Numbers 12:3 (Now the man <u>Moses</u> was very <u>meek</u>, above all the men which were upon the face of the earth.)

- Acts 28:7,8 In that region there was an estate of the leading citizen of the island, whose name was Publius, who received us and entertained us courteously for three days. 8 And it happened that the father of Publius lay sick of a fever and dysentery. Paul went in to him and prayed, and he laid his hands on him and healed him.
- Mark 2:3,5 And they come unto him, bringing one sick of the palsy, which was borne of four. 5 When Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee. (faith of friends)
- Acts 28:9 So when this was done, the rest of those on the island who had diseases also came and were healed.
- John 15:20 Remember the word that I said unto <u>you</u>, The servant is not greater than his lord. <u>If they have persecuted me, they will also persecute you</u>; if they have kept my saying, they will keep yours also.
- Acts 28:10 They also honored us in many ways; and when we departed, they provided such things as were necessary.
- Romans 12:1,2 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.
- Psalms 55:8 I would hasten my <u>escape</u> from the windy storm *and* tempest. Psalm 23:4 Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou *art* with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.
- Psalms 31:15 My times are in thy hand: deliver me from the hand of mine enemies, and from them that persecute me.
- Psalms 56:7 Shall they <u>escape</u> by iniquity? in *thine* anger cast down the people, O God.
- Psalms 71:2 <u>Deliver me in thy righteousness, and cause me to escape</u>: incline thine ear unto me, and save me.
- Matthew 14:29,30 And he said, Come. And when Peter was come down out of the ship, he <u>walked</u> on the <u>water</u>, to go to Jesus. 30 But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me.
- Mark 4:38-40 And he was in the hinder part of the ship, asleep on a pillow: and they awake him, and say unto him, Master, <u>carest</u> thou <u>not</u> that <u>we perish</u>? 39 And he arose, and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, Peace, be still. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. 40 And he said unto them, Why are ye so fearful? how is it that ye have no faith?
- Psalms 124:7 Our soul is <u>escaped</u> as a bird out of the snare of the fowlers: the snare is broken, and we are escaped.
- Psalm 23:3A 3 He restoreth my soul:

- Psalms 141:10 Let the wicked fall into their own nets, whilst that I withal <u>escape</u>.
- Luke 10:27 And he answering said, Thou shalt <u>love</u> the Lord thy <u>God</u> with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy <u>neighbour</u> as thyself.
- Luke 10:25-37 And, behold, a certain lawyer stood up, and tempted him, saying, Master, what shall I do to inherit eternal life? 26 He said unto him, What is written in the law? how readest thou? 27 And he answering said, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbour as thyself. 28 And he said unto him, Thou hast answered right: this do, and thou shalt live. 29 But he, willing to justify himself, said unto Jesus, And who is my neighbour? 30 And Jesus answering said, A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among thieves, which stripped him of his raiment, and wounded him, and departed, leaving him half dead. 31 And by chance there came down a certain priest that way: and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. 32 And likewise a Levite, when he was at the place, came and looked on him, and passed by on the other side. 33 But a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was: and when he saw him, he had compassion on him, 34 And went to him, and bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine, and set him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn, and took care of him. 35 And on the morrow when he departed, he took out two pence, and gave them to the host, and said unto him, Take care of him; and whatsoever thou spendest more, when I come again, I will repay thee. 36 Which now of these three, thinkest thou, was neighbour unto him that fell among the thieves? 37 And he said, He that shewed mercy on him. Then said Jesus unto him, Go, and do thou likewise.
- Luke 10:2 Therefore said he unto them, The <u>harvest</u> truly *is* great, but the labourers *are* few: pray ye therefore the <u>Lord</u> of the <u>harvest</u>, that he would send forth labourers into his <u>harvest</u>.
- John 12:8 For the <u>poor always</u> ye <u>have</u> with you; but me ye <u>have</u> not <u>always</u>. Job 2:9,10 Then said his wife unto him, Dost thou still retain thine integrity? <u>curse God</u>, and <u>die</u>. 10 But he said unto her, Thou speakest as one of the foolish women speaketh. What? shall we receive <u>good</u> at the hand of God, and shall we not receive <u>evil</u>? In all this did not Job sin with his lips.
- Job 2:3 And the LORD said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant <u>Job</u>, that *there is* none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil? and still he holdeth fast his <u>integrity</u>, although thou movedst me against him, to destroy him without cause.

- Luke 13:1-5 There were present at that season some that told him of the Galilaeans, whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. 2 And Jesus answering said unto them, Suppose ye that these Galilaeans were sinners above all the Galilaeans, because they suffered such things? 3 I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall (you will) all likewise perish. 4 Or those eighteen, upon whom the tower in Siloam fell, and slew them, think ye that they were sinners above all men that dwelt in Jerusalem? 5 I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall (you will) all likewise perish.
- 1 King 18:37 Hear me, O LORD, hear me, that this people may know that thou *art* the LORD God, and *that* thou hast turned their heart back again.
- Matthew 10:23 But when they <u>persecute</u> you in this city, <u>flee</u> ye into another: for verily I say unto you, Ye shall not have gone over the cities of Israel, till the Son of man be come.
- Acts 14:8-16 And there sat a certain man at Lystra, impotent in his feet, being a cripple from his mother's womb, who never had walked: 9 The same heard Paul speak: who stedfastly beholding him, and perceiving that he had faith to be healed, 10 Said with a loud voice, Stand upright on thy feet. And he leaped and walked. 11 And when the people saw what Paul had done, they lifted up their voices, saying in the speech of Lycaonia, The gods are come down to us in the likeness of men. 12 And they called Barnabas, Jupiter; and Paul, Mercury, because he was the chief speaker. 13 Then the priest of Jupiter, which was before their city, brought oxen and garlands unto the gates, and would have done sacrifice with the people. 14 Which when the apostles, Barnabas and Paul, heard of, they rent their clothes, and ran in among the people, crying out, 15 And saying, Sirs, why do ye these things? We also are men of like passions with you, and preach unto you that ye should turn from these vanities unto the living God, which made heaven, and earth, and the sea, and all things that are therein: 16 Who in times past suffered all nations to walk in their own ways.
- Acts 14:19,20 And there came thither *certain* Jews from Antioch and Iconium, who persuaded the people, and, having stoned Paul, drew *him* out of the city, supposing he had been dead. 20 Howbeit, as the disciples stood round about him, he rose up, and came into the city: and the next day he departed with Barnabas to Derbe.
