Woe To Devourers Of Widows - Matthew 23C

- Exodus 22:22,23 Ye shall not afflict any widow, or fatherless child. 23 If thou afflict them in any wise, and they cry at all unto me, I (the Lord God) will surely hear their cry;
- Matthew 23:13 But woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye shut up the kingdom of heaven against men: for ye neither go in yourselves, neither suffer ye them that are entering to go in.
- Deuteronomy 10:18 (the Lord God) He doth execute the judgment of the fatherless and widow, and loveth the stranger, in giving him food and raiment.
- Matthew 23:14 (AV) Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye devour widows' houses, and for a pretence make long prayer: therefore ye shall receive the greater damnation.
- Matthew 3:2 And saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.
- Matthew 4:17 From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.
- John 10:38 But if I do, though ye believe not Me, believe the works: that ye may know, and believe, that the Father is in Me, and I in Him.
- John 15:24 If I had not done among them the works which none other man did, they had not had sin: but now have they both seen and hated both Me and My Father.
- Matthew 23:14 (NKJV) Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you devour widows' houses, and for a pretense make long prayers.

 Therefore you will receive greater condemnation.
- Matthew 23:15 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye compass sea and land to make one proselyte, and when he is made, ye make him twofold more the child of hell than yourselves.
- Matthew 7:15 Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves.
- Luke 18 Summarized of the parable of the Pharisee & the publican.
- Luke 18:11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican.
- Luke 18:13,14 And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be

- merciful to me a sinner. 14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.
- Mark 7:6 He answered and said unto them, Well hath Esaias prophesied of you hypocrites, as it is written, This people honoureth Me with their lips, but their heart is far from Me.
- Isaiah 29:13 Wherefore the Lord said, Forasmuch as this people draw near Me with their mouth, and with their lips do honour Me, but have removed their heart far from Me, and their fear toward Me is taught by the precept of men:
- Referred to Jesus cleaning out the Temple twice.
- Matthew 21:13 And said unto them, It is written, My house shall be called the house of prayer; but ye have made it a den of thieves.
- Revelation 2 & 3 Referred to the letters to the 7 Churches.
- Matthew 23:2 Saying, The scribes and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat:
- Matthew 7:21 Not every one that saith unto Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of My Father which is in heaven.
- Matthew 7:13 Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat:
- Psalms 68:5 A father of the fatherless, and a judge of the widows, is God in his holy habitation.
- Psalms 146:9 The LORD preserveth the strangers; he relieveth the fatherless and widow: but the way of the wicked he turneth upside down.
- Ruth 1:16 And Ruth said, Intreat me not to leave thee, or to return from following after thee: for whither thou goest, I will go; and where thou lodgest, I will lodge: thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God:
- Proverbs 15:25 The LORD will destroy the house of the proud: but he will establish the border of the widow.
- John 10:10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.
- ISBE WIDOW wid'-o (almanah; chera): In the Old Testament widows are considered to be under the special care of Yahweh (Ps 68:5; 146:9; Prov 15:25). Sympathetic regard for them comes to be viewed as a mark of true religion (Job 31:16; James 1:27). Deuteronomy is rich in counsel in

their behalf (24:17, etc.). The word is first mentioned in the New Testament in Acts 6:1: There arose a murmuring of the Grecian Jews against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily ministration. Paul charges that they be particularly cared for, especially those that are widows indeed, i.e. poor, without support and old (1Tim 5:2-16). Some try to find proof in this passage of that ecclesiastical order of widows mentioned in post-apostolic writings. - George B. Eager

Ruth - Referred to God taking care of 2 widows.

- Strongs #5503 chera *khay'-rah* AV-widow 27; 1) a widow 2) metaph. a city stripped of its inhabitants and riches is represented under the figure of a widow
- Matthew 23:14 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye devour <u>widows</u>' houses, and for a pretence make long prayer: therefore ye shall receive the greater damnation.
- Mark 12:40 Which devour <u>widows</u>' houses, and for a pretence make long prayers: these shall receive greater damnation.
- Mark 12:42 And there came a certain poor <u>widow</u>, and she threw in two mites, which make a farthing.
- Mark 12:43 And he called *unto him* his disciples, and saith unto them, Verily I say unto you, That this poor <u>widow</u> hath cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury:
- 1 Kings 17:12 And she said, As the LORD thy God liveth, I have not a cake, but an handful of meal in a barrel, and a little oil in a cruse: and, behold, I am gathering two sticks, that I may go in and dress it for me and my son, that we may eat it, and die.
- Luke 2:37 And she *was* a <u>widow</u> of about fourscore and four years, which departed not from the temple, but served *God* with fastings and prayers night and day.
- Luke 4:25,26 But I tell you of a truth, many <u>widows</u> were in Israel in the days of Elias, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, when great famine was throughout all the land; 26 But unto none of them was Elias sent, save unto Sarepta, *a city* of Sidon, unto a woman *that was* a widow.
- Judges 8 Referred to Gideon & 300 men won the battle of the Lord.
- Luke 7:12 Now when he came nigh to the gate of the city, behold, there was a dead man carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow: and much people of the city was with her.
- Luke 18:3 And there was a widow in that city; and she came unto him,

- saying, Avenge me of mine adversary.
- Luke 18:5 Yet because this <u>widow</u> troubleth me, I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming she weary me.
- Luke 18:7 And shall not God avenge His own elect, which cry day and night unto Him, though He bear long with them?
- Luke 20:47 Which devour <u>widows</u>' houses, and for a shew make long prayers: the same shall receive greater damnation.
- Luke 21:2,3 And he saw also a certain poor <u>widow</u> casting in thither two mites. 3 And he said, Of a truth I say unto you, that this poor <u>widow</u> hath cast in more than they all:
- Acts 6:1-4 And in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplied, there arose a murmuring of the Grecians against the Hebrews, because their <u>widows</u> were neglected in the daily ministration. 2 Then the twelve called the multitude of the disciples unto them, and said, It is not reason that we should leave the Word of God, and serve tables. 3 Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business. 4 But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the Word.
- Acts 9:39 Then Peter arose and went with them. When he was come, they brought him into the upper chamber: and all the <u>widows</u> stood by him weeping, and shewing the coats and garments which Dorcas made, while she was with them.
- Acts 9:41 And he gave her *his* hand, and lifted her up, and when he had called the saints and widows, presented her alive.
- 1 Corinthians 7:8 I say therefore to the unmarried and <u>widows</u>, It is good for them if they abide even as I.
- 1 Corinthians 7:32 But I would have you without carefulness. He that is unmarried careth for the things that belong to the Lord, how he may please the Lord: 33 But he that is married careth for the things that are of the world, how he may please his wife. 34 There is difference also between a wife and a virgin. The unmarried woman careth for the things of the Lord, that she may be holy both in body and in spirit: but she that is married careth for the things of the world, how she may please her husband.
- 1 Timothy 5:3-5 Honour <u>widows</u> that are <u>widows</u> indeed. 4 But if any <u>widow</u> have children or nephews, let them learn first to shew piety at home, and to requite their parents: for that is good and acceptable before God.

- 5 Now she that is a <u>widow</u> indeed, and desolate, trusteth in God, and continueth in supplications and prayers night and day.
- 1 Timothy 5:9 Let not a <u>widow</u> be taken into the number under threescore years old, having been the wife of one man,
- 1 Timothy 5:11 But the younger <u>widows</u> refuse: for when they have begun to wax wanton against Christ, they will marry;
- 1 Timothy 5:16 If any man or woman that believeth have <u>widows</u>, let them relieve them, and let not the church be charged; that it may relieve them that are widows indeed.
- James 1:27 Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and <u>widows</u> in their affliction, *and* to keep himself unspotted from the world.
- Revelation 18:7 How much she hath glorified herself, and lived deliciously, so much torment and sorrow give her: for she saith in her heart, I sit a queen, and am no <u>widow</u>, and shall see no sorrow.
- Exodus 12:12 For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night, and will smite all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment: I am the LORD.
- 1 Timothy 5:3-16 V3-5 Honour widows that are widows indeed. 4 But if any widow have children or nephews, let them learn first to shew piety at home, and to requite (repay) their parents: for that is good and acceptable before God. 5 Now she that is a widow indeed, and desolate, trusteth in God, and continueth in supplications and prayers night and day. (like Anna)
- Matthew 6:33 But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.
- 1 Timothy 2:1,2 I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; 2 For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.
- 1 Timothy 5:6 But she that liveth in pleasure is dead while she liveth.
- 1 John 2:15 Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him.
- 1 Timothy 5:7 And these things give in charge, that they may be blameless. Paul's writings give instruction for the new Christian Church.
- Exodus 20 Has God's instructions for the Israelites new from Egypt.
- 1 Timothy 5:8 But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel.

- Mark 7:11,12 But ye say, If a man shall say to his father or mother, It is Corban, that is to say, a gift, by whatsoever thou mightest be profited by me; he shall be free. 12 And ye suffer him no more to do ought for his father or his mother;
- 1 Timothy 5:9,10 Let not a widow be taken into the number under threescore years old, having been the wife of one man, 10 Well reported of for good works; if she have brought up children, if she have lodged strangers, if she have washed the saints' feet, if she have relieved the afflicted, if she have diligently followed every good work.

Proverbs 31 Referred to the Virtuous Woman.

- 1 Peter 4:9 Use hospitality one to another without grudging.
- Leviticus 19:18 Thou shalt not avenge, nor bear any grudge against the children of thy people, but thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself: I am the LORD.
- 1 Timothy 5:11-14 But the younger widows refuse: for when they have begun to wax wanton against Christ, they will marry; 12 Having damnation, because they have cast off their first faith. 13 And withal they learn to be idle, wandering about from house to house; and not only idle, but tattlers also and busybodies, speaking things which they ought not. 14 I will therefore that the younger women marry, bear children, guide the house, give none occasion to the adversary to speak reproachfully.
- Titus 2:4 That they (elderly women) may teach the young women to be sober, to love their husbands, to love their children,
- 1 Timothy 5:15,16 For some are already turned aside after Satan. 16 If any man or woman that believeth have widows, let them relieve them, and let not the church be charged; that it may relieve them that are widows indeed.
- Luke 18 Pray like the persistent widow.
- Luke 18:7,8 And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them? 8 I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?
