- Luke 24:27 And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, He expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning Himself.
- Proverbs 25:1-28 (AV) & (NKJV)
- Proverbs 25:1 (AV) These *are* also proverbs of Solomon, which the men of Hezekiah king of Judah copied out.
- Proverbs 25:1 (NKJV) These also *are* proverbs of Solomon which the men of Hezekiah king of Judah copied:
- Deuteronomy 17:18 And it shall be, when he sitteth upon the throne of his kingdom, that he shall write him a copy of this law in a book out of that which is before the priests the Levites:
- Proverbs 25:2 (AV) *It is* the glory of God to conceal a thing: but the honour of kings *is* to search out a matter.
- Proverbs 25:2 (NKJV) *It is* the glory of God to conceal a matter, But the glory of kings *is* to search out a matter.
- Proverbs 25:3 (AV) The heaven for height, and the earth for depth, and the heart of kings *is* unsearchable.
- Proverbs 25:3 (NKJV) As the heavens for height and the earth for depth, So the heart of kings is unsearchable.
- Proverbs 21:1 The king's heart is in the hand of the LORD, as the rivers of water: He turneth it whithersoever He will.
- 1 Timothy 2:1,2 I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; 2 For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.
- Proverbs 25:4 (AV) Take away the dross from the silver, and there shall come forth a vessel for the finer.
- Proverbs 25:4 (NKJV) Take away the dross from silver, And it will go to the silversmith *for* jewelry.
- Esther 4:14 For if thou altogether holdest thy peace at this time, then shall there enlargement and deliverance arise to the Jews from another place; but thou and thy father's house shall be destroyed: and who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for such a time as this?
- Luke 11:24-26 When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest; and finding none, he saith, I will return unto my house whence I came out. 25 And when he cometh, he findeth it swept and garnished. 26 Then goeth he, and taketh to him seven other

- spirits more wicked than himself; and they enter in, and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first.
- Proverbs 25:5 (AV) Take away the wicked *from* before the king, and his throne shall be established in righteousness.
- Proverbs 25:5 (NKJV) Take away the wicked from before the king, And his throne will be established in righteousness.
- Proverbs 25:6 (AV) Put not forth thyself in the presence of the king, and stand not in the place of great *men*:
- Proverbs 25:6 (NKJV) Do not exalt yourself in the presence of the king, And do not stand in the place of the great;
- Proverbs 25:7 (AV) For better *it is* that it be said unto thee, Come up hither; than that thou shouldest be put lower in the presence of the prince whom thine eyes have seen.
- Proverbs 25:7 (NKJV) For *it is* better that he say to you, Come up here, Than that you should be put lower in the presence of the prince, Whom your eyes have seen.
- Luke 14:8-10 When thou art bidden of any man to a wedding, sit not down in the highest room; lest a more honourable man than thou be bidden of him; 9 And he that bade thee & him come and say to thee, Give this man place; and thou begin with shame to take the lowest room. 10 But when thou art bidden, go and sit down in the lowest room; that when he that bade thee cometh, he may say unto thee, Friend, go up higher: then shalt thou have worship in the presence of them that sit at meat with thee.
- Romans 12:3 For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith.
- Proverbs 25:8 (AV) Go not forth hastily to strive, lest *thou know not* what to do in the end thereof, when thy neighbour hath put thee to shame.
- Proverbs 25:8 (NKJV) Do not go hastily to court; For what will you do in the end, When your neighbor has put you to shame?
- 1 Corinthians 6:6,7 But brother goeth to law with brother, and that before the unbelievers. 7 Now therefore there is utterly a fault among you, because ye go to law one with another. Why do ye not rather take wrong? why do ye not rather suffer yourselves to be defrauded?

- Proverbs 25:9 (AV) Debate thy cause with thy neighbour *himself*; and discover not a secret to another:
- Proverbs 25:9 (NKJV) Debate your case with your neighbor, And do not disclose the secret to another;
- Matthew 18:15-17 Moreover if thy brother shall trespass against thee, go and tell him his fault between thee and him alone: if he shall hear thee, thou hast gained thy brother. 16 But if he will not hear thee, then take with thee one or two more, that in the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established. 17 And if he shall neglect to hear them, tell it unto the church: but if he neglect to hear the church, let him be unto thee as an heathen man and a publican.
- Proverbs 25:10 (AV) Lest he that heareth *it* put thee to shame, and thine infamy turn not away.
- Proverbs 25:10 (NKJV) Lest he who hears *it* expose your shame, And your reputation be ruined.
- Proverbs 26:20 Where no wood is, there the fire goeth out: so where there is no talebearer, the strife ceaseth.
- Proverbs 25:11 (AV) A word fitly spoken *is like* apples of gold in pictures of silver.
- Proverbs 25:11 (NKJV) A word fitly spoken *is like* apples of gold In settings of silver.
- Proverbs 21:23 Whoso keepeth his mouth and his tongue keepeth his soul from troubles.
- Proverbs 25:12 (AV) *As* an earring of gold, and an ornament of fine gold, *so is* a wise reprover upon an obedient ear.
- Proverbs 25:12 (NKJV) *Like* an earring of gold and an ornament of fine gold *Is* a wise rebuker to an obedient ear.
- Jeremiah 5:3 O LORD, are not thine eyes upon the truth? thou hast stricken them, but they have not grieved; thou hast consumed them, but they have refused to receive correction: they have made their faces harder than a rock; they have refused to return.
- Proverbs 25:13 (AV) As the cold of snow in the time of harvest, so is a <u>faithful</u> messenger to them that send him: for he refresheth the soul of his masters.
- Proverbs 25:13 (NKJV) Like the cold of snow in time of harvest *Is* a faithful messenger to those who send him, For he refreshes the soul of his masters.
- Referred to many Parables our Lord Jesus used to teach the people.
- Daniel 1:8 But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's meat, nor with the wine which he drank:

- therefore he requested of the prince of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself.
- Proverbs 25:14 (AV) Whoso boasteth himself of a false gift *is like* clouds and wind without rain.
- Proverbs 25:14 (NKJV) Whoever falsely boasts of giving *Is like* clouds and wind without rain.
- Acts 5 Summarized of Ananias & Sapphira lying to the Holy Spirit.
- Luke 21:3,4 And He said, Of a truth I say unto you, that this poor widow hath cast in more than they all: 4 For all these have of their abundance cast in unto the offerings of God: but she of her penury hath cast in all the living that she had.
- Proverbs 25:15 (AV) By long forbearing is a prince persuaded, and a soft tongue breaketh the bone.
- Proverbs 25:15 (NKJV) By long forbearance (patience) a ruler is persuaded, And a gentle tongue breaks a bone.
- Luke 18 Summarized of the persistant widow. V7 And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them?
- Luke 8:11 Now the parable is this: The seed is the Word of God. (mis-used)
- Acts 8:11 And to him they had regard, because that of long time he had bewitched them with sorceries.
- Referred to Jesus cleaning out the Temple twice.
- Matthew 21:13 And said unto them, It is written, My house shall be called the house of prayer; but ye have made it a den of thieves.
- Proverbs 25:16 (AV) Hast thou found honey? eat so much as is sufficient for thee, lest thou be filled therewith, and vomit it.
- Proverbs 25:16 (NKJV) Have you found honey? Eat only as much as you need, Lest you be filled with it and vomit.
- 1 Samuel 14 Referred to Jonathan finding honey.
- Galatians 5:22,23 (NKJV) But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.
- Proverbs 25:17 (AV) Withdraw thy foot from thy neighbour's house; lest he be weary of thee, and so hate thee.
- Proverbs 25:17 (NKJV) Seldom set foot in your neighbor's house, Lest he become weary of you and hate you.
- Proverbs 25:18 (AV) A man that beareth false witness against his neighbour *is* a maul, and a sword, and a sharp arrow.
- Proverbs 25:18 (NKJV) A man who <u>bears false witness against his neighbor</u> *Is like* a club, a sword, and a sharp arrow.

- Proverbs 25:19 (AV) Confidence in an <u>unfaithful</u> man in time of trouble *is like* a broken tooth, and a foot out of joint.
- Proverbs 25:19 (NKJV) Confidence in an unfaithful *man* in time of trouble *Is like* a bad tooth and a foot out of joint.
- Proverbs 25:20 (AV) *As* he that taketh away a garment in cold weather, *and* as vinegar upon nitre, so is he that singeth songs to an heavy heart.
- Proverbs 25:20 (NKJV) *Like* one who takes away a garment in cold weather, & *as* vinegar on soda, *Is* one who sings songs to a heavy heart.
- Job 2:13 So they sat down with him upon the ground seven days and seven nights, and none spake a word unto him: for they saw that his grief was very great.
- 2 Corinthians 1:3,4 Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort; 4 Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God.
- Proverbs 25:21 (AV) If thine enemy be hungry, give him bread to eat; and if he be thirsty, give him water to drink:
- Proverbs 25:21 (NKJV) If your enemy is hungry, give him bread to eat; And if he is thirsty, give him water to drink;
- Proverbs 25:22 (AV) For thou shalt heap coals of fire upon his head, and the LORD shall reward thee.
- Proverbs 25:22 (NKJV) For *so* you will heap coals of fire on his head, And the LORD will reward you.
- Romans 12:19 Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.
- Genesis 19:24 Then the LORD rained upon Sodom and upon Gomorrah brimstone and fire from the LORD out of heaven;
- 2 Kings 6 Summarized of the Syrians against Elisha in Dothan. V23 And he prepared great provision for them: and when they had eaten and drunk, he sent them away, and they went to their master. So the bands of Syria came no more into the land of Israel.
- Proverbs 25:23 (AV) The north wind driveth away rain: so *doth* an angry countenance a backbiting tongue.
- Proverbs 25:23 (NKJV) The north wind brings forth rain, And a backbiting tongue an angry countenance.
- Proverbs 25:24 (AV) *It is* better to dwell in the corner of the housetop, than with a brawling woman and in a wide house.
- Proverbs 25:24 (NKJV) It is better to dwell in a corner of a housetop, Than

- in a house shared with a contentious woman.
- 1 Kings 11:3,4 And he (Solomon) had seven hundred wives, princesses, and three hundred concubines: and his wives turned away his heart.
- Proverbs 25:25 (AV) *As* cold waters to a thirsty soul, so *is* good news from a far country.
- Proverbs 25:25 (NKJV) *As* cold water to a weary soul, So *is* good news from a far country.
- Proverbs 25:26 (AV) A righteous man falling down before the wicked *is as* a troubled fountain, and a corrupt spring.
- Proverbs 25:26 (NKJV) A righteous *man* who falters before the wicked *Is like* a murky spring and a polluted well.
- Proverbs 25:27 (AV) *It is* not good to eat much honey: so *for men* to search their own glory *is not* glory.
- Proverbs 25:27 (NKJV) *It is* not good to eat much honey; So to seek one's own glory *is not* glory.
- Matthew 23 Referred to the religious leaders seeking glory. V12 And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and he that shall humble himself shall be exalted.
- Proverbs 25:28 (AV) He that *hath* no rule over his own spirit *is like* a city *that is* broken down, *and* without walls.
- Proverbs 25:28 (NKJV) Whoever *has* no rule over his own spirit *Is like* a city broken down, without walls.
- Revelation 3:7 And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These things saith he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David, he that openeth, & no man shutteth; & shutteth, and no man openeth;
- 1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- 2 Chronicles 7:14 If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.
- James 1:22 But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves.
