God Sees The Evil And Soon Will Intervene - Habakkuk 1

- 2 Peter 3:9 The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.
- Amos interceded 4 times for sinful Israel & 3 times God relented, but the forth time judgement fell.
- Revelation 6:9,10 And when he had opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of them that were slain for the Word of God, and for the testimony which they held: 10 And they cried with a loud voice, saying, How long, O Lord, Holy and True, dost Thou not judge and avenge our blood on them that dwell on the earth?
- **Ezekiel 33 Referred to the watchman sound warning.**
- Isaiah 36 & 37 Referred to Hezekiah & Isaiah vs Sennacherib.
- 2 Kings 23 Summarized of Josiah cleaning out evil from the land & his death.
- Ezekiel 13:19 will ye pollute Me among My people for handfuls of barley & for pieces of bread, to slay the souls that should not die, & to save the souls alive that should not live, by your lying to My people that hear your lies?
- Strongs #02265 Chabaqquwq *khab-ak-kook'* AV-Habakkuk 2; Habakkuk = embrace 1) a prophet of Israel who wrote the book by that name; probably lived about the 12th or 13th year of the reign of Josiah.
- Daniel 9:2,3 In the first year of his reign I Daniel understood by books the number of the years, whereof the word of the LORD came to Jeremiah the prophet, that he would accomplish seventy years in the desolations of Jerusalem. 3 And I set my face unto the Lord God, to seek by prayer and supplications, with fasting, and sackcloth, and ashes:
- Habakkuk 1:1-17 (AV) & (NKJV)
- Habakkuk 1:1 (AV) The burden which Habakkuk the prophet did see.
- Habakkuk 1:1 (NKJV) The burden which the prophet Habakkuk saw.
- Habakkuk 1:2 (AV) O LORD, how long shall I cry, and thou wilt not hear! *even* cry out unto thee *of* violence, and thou wilt not save!
- Habakkuk 1:2 (NKJV) O LORD, how long shall I cry, And You will not hear? Even cry out to You, Violence! And You will not save.
- 1 John 2:22 Who is a liar but he that denieth that Jesus is the Christ? He is antichrist, that denieth the Father and the Son.
- John 8:44 Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of

his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it.

Jeremiah 7,11, & 14 God said "pray not for them".

Revelation 3:7-11 And when they shall have finished their testimony, the beast that ascendeth out of the bottomless pit shall make war against them, and shall overcome them, and kill them. 8 And their dead bodies shall lie in the street of the great city, which spiritually is called Sodom and Egypt, where also our Lord was crucified. 9 And they of the people and kindreds and tongues and nations shall see their dead bodies three days and an half, and shall not suffer their dead bodies to be put in graves. 10 And they that dwell upon the earth shall rejoice over them, and make merry, and shall send gifts one to another; because these two prophets tormented them that dwelt on the earth. 11 And after three days and an half the Spirit of life from God entered into them, and they stood upon their feet; and great fear fell upon them which saw them.

Habakkuk 1:3 (AV) Why dost thou shew me iniquity, and cause *me* to behold grievance? for spoiling and violence *are* before me: and there are *that* raise up strife and contention.

Habakkuk 1:3 (NKJV) Why do You show me iniquity, And cause *me* to see trouble? For plundering and violence *are* before me; There is strife, and contention arises.

Jonah Summarized of Jonah & Nineveh repented.

Nahum Summarized of judgment 100 years later in Nineveh. Nahum 2:6 The gates of the rivers shall be opened, and the palace shall be dissolved.

Habakkuk 1:4 (AV) Therefore the law is slacked, and judgment doth never go forth: for the wicked doth compass about the righteous; therefore wrong judgment proceedeth.

Habakkuk 1:4 (NKJV) Therefore the law is powerless, And justice never goes forth. For the wicked surround the righteous; Therefore perverse judgment proceeds.

Exodus Summarized of God bringing Israel out of Egypt.

Exodus 20 Referred to the 10 Commandments to guide the Israelites.

Exodus 32 Referred to the golden calf idolatry.

Numbers 14:2 And all the children of Israel murmured against Moses and against Aaron: and the whole congregation said unto them, Would God that we had died in the land of Egypt! or would God we had died in this wilderness!

Numbers 14:22-24 Because all those men which have seen My glory, and My miracles, which I did in Egypt and in the wilderness, and have tempted Me now these ten times, and have not hearkened to My voice; 23 Surely they shall not see the land which I sware unto their fathers, neither shall any of

- them that provoked Me see it: 24 But My servant Caleb, because he had another spirit with him, and hath followed Me fully, him will I bring into the land whereinto he went; and his seed shall possess it.
- Habakkuk 1:5 (AV) Behold ye among the heathen, and regard, and wonder marvellously: for *I* will work a work in your days, *which* ye will not believe, though it be told *you*.
- Habakkuk 1:5 (NKJV) Look among the nations and watch, Be utterly astounded! For *I will* work a work in your days *Which* you would not believe, though it were told *you*.
- Joshua 2:9 And she said unto the men, I know that the LORD hath given you the land, and that your terror is fallen upon us, and that all the inhabitants of the land faint because of you.
- Isaiah 63:10 But they (Israel) rebelled, and vexed His Holy Spirit: therefore He was turned to be their enemy, and He fought against them.
- Habakkuk 1:6 (AV) For, Io, I raise up the Chaldeans, *that* bitter and hasty nation, which shall march through the breadth of the land, to possess the dwellingplaces *that are* not theirs.
- Habakkuk 1:6 (NKJV) For indeed I am raising up the Chaldeans, A bitter and hasty nation Which marches through the breadth of the earth, To possess dwelling places *that are* not theirs.
- 2 Kings 23 Summarized of Josiah cleaning out ungodliness from the land.
- Habakkuk 1:7 (AV) They *are* terrible and dreadful: their judgment and their dignity shall proceed of themselves.
- Habakkuk 1:7 (NKJV) They are terrible and dreadful; Their judgment and their dignity proceed from themselves.
- John 10:10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, & to kill, & to destroy: I am come that they might have life, & that they might have it more abundantly.
- Habakkuk 1:8 (AV) Their horses also are swifter than the leopards, and are more fierce than the evening wolves: and their horsemen shall spread themselves, and their horsemen shall come from far; they shall fly as the eagle *that* hasteth to eat.
- Habakkuk 1:8 (NKJV) Their horses also are swifter than leopards, And more fierce than evening wolves. Their chargers charge ahead; Their cavalry comes from afar; They fly as the eagle *that* hastens to eat.
- Habakkuk 1:9 (AV) They shall come all for violence: their faces shall sup up as the east wind, and they shall gather the captivity as the sand.
- Habakkuk 1:9 (NKJV) They all come for violence; Their faces are set *like* the east wind. They gather captives like sand.
- Psalms 140:1 « To the chief Musician, A Psalm of David. » Deliver me, O LORD, from the evil man: preserve me from the violent man;

- Habakkuk 1:10 (AV) And they shall scoff at the kings, and the princes shall be a scorn unto them: they shall deride every strong hold; for they shall heap dust, and take it.
- Habakkuk 1:10 (NKJV) They scoff at kings, And princes are scorned by them. They deride every stronghold, For they heap up earthen *mounds* & seize it.
- Referred to Sennacherib & Goliath taunting God & God dealing with them.
- Habakkuk 1:11 (AV) Then shall *his* mind change, and he shall pass over, and offend, *imputing* this his power unto his god.
- Habakkuk 1:11 (NKJV) Then *his* mind changes, and he transgresses; he commits offense, *Ascribing* this power to his god.
- 1 Samuel 4 Summarized of the Ark of God taken in battle.
- Revelation 8:13 And I beheld, and heard an angel flying through the midst of heaven, saying with a loud voice, Woe, woe, woe, to the inhabiters of the earth by reason of the other voices of the trumpet of the three angels, which are yet to sound!
- Revelation 6:16 And said to the mountains & rocks, Fall on us, & hide us from the face of him that sitteth on the throne, & from the wrath of the Lamb:
- Genesis 3:10 And he said, I heard thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself.
- Habakkuk 1:12 (AV) *Art* thou not from everlasting, O LORD my God, mine Holy One? we shall not die. O LORD, Thou hast ordained them for judgment; and, O mighty God, Thou hast established them for correction.
- Habakkuk 1:12 (NKJV) Are You not from everlasting, O LORD my God, my Holy One? We shall not die. O LORD, You have appointed them for judgment; O Rock, You have marked them for correction.
- Exodus 12:12 For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night, and will smite all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment: I am the LORD.
- Hebrews 13:8 Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever.
- John 14:2 In My Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto Myself; that where I am, there ye may be also.
- 2 Chronicles 7:13,14 If I shut up heaven that there be no rain, or if I command the locusts to devour the land, or if I send pestilence among My people; 14 If My people, which are called by My Name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.
- Habakkuk 1:13 (AV) *Thou art* of purer eyes than to behold evil, and canst not look on iniquity: wherefore lookest Thou upon them that deal

- treacherously, *and* holdest Thy tongue when the wicked devoureth *the* man that is more righteous than he?
- Habakkuk 1:13 (NKJV) You are of purer eyes than to behold evil, And cannot look on wickedness. Why do You look on those who deal treacherously, And hold Your tongue when the wicked devours a person more righteous than he?
- John 10:10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, & to kill, & to destroy: I am come that they might have life, & that they might have it more abundantly.
- Proverbs 22:22,23 Rob not the poor, because he is poor: neither oppress the afflicted in the gate: 23 For the LORD will plead their cause, and spoil the soul of those that spoiled them.
- Habakkuk 1:14 (AV) And makest men as the fishes of the sea, as the creeping things, *that have* no ruler over them?
- Habakkuk 1:14 (NKJV) Why do You make men like fish of the sea, Like creeping things that have no ruler over them?
- Habakkuk 1:15 (AV) They take up all of them with the angle, they catch them in their net, & gather them in their drag: therefore they rejoice & are glad.
- Habakkuk 1:15 (NKJV) They take up all of them with a hook, They catch them in their net, And gather them in their dragnet. Therefore they rejoice and are glad.
- Habakkuk 1:16 (AV) Therefore they sacrifice unto their net, & burn incense to their drag; because by them their portion *is* fat, & their meat plenteous.
- Habakkuk 1:16 (NKJV) Therefore they sacrifice to their net, And burn incense to their dragnet; Because by them their share *is* sumptuous And their food plentiful.
- Habakkuk 1:17 (AV) Shall they therefore empty their net, and not spare continually to slay the nations?
- Habakkuk 1:17 (NKJV) Shall they therefore empty their net, And continue to slay nations without pity?
- More service Notes: (Summarized)
- Daniel 4:19-33 Then Daniel, whose name was Belteshazzar, was astonied for one hour, and his thoughts troubled him. The king spake, and said, Belteshazzar, let not the dream, or the interpretation thereof, trouble thee. Belteshazzar answered and said, My lord, the dream be to them that hate thee, and the interpretation thereof to thine enemies. 20 The tree that thou sawest, which grew, and was strong, whose height reached unto the heaven, and the sight thereof to all the earth; 21 Whose leaves were fair, and the fruit thereof much, and in it was meat for all; under which the beasts of the field dwelt, and upon whose branches the fowls of the heaven had their habitation: 22 It is thou, 0 king, that art grown and

become strong: for thy greatness is grown, and reacheth unto heaven, and thy dominion to the end of the earth. 23 And whereas the king saw a watcher and an Holy One coming down from heaven, and saying, Hew the tree down, and destroy it; yet leave the stump of the roots thereof in the earth, even with a band of iron and brass, in the tender grass of the field; and let it be wet with the dew of heaven, and let his portion be with the beasts of the field, till seven times pass over him; 24 This is the interpretation, O king, and this is the decree of the most High, which is come upon my lord the king: 25 That they shall drive thee from men, and thy dwelling shall be with the beasts of the field, and they shall make thee to eat grass as oxen, and they shall wet thee with the dew of heaven, and seven times shall pass over thee, till thou know that the most High ruleth in the kingdom of men, and giveth it to whomsoever he will. 26 And whereas they commanded to leave the stump of the tree roots; thy kingdom shall be sure unto thee, after that thou shalt have known that the heavens do rule. 27 Wherefore, O king, let my counsel be acceptable unto thee, and break off thy sins by righteousness, and thine iniquities by shewing mercy to the poor; if it may be a lengthening of thy tranquillity. 28 All this came upon the king Nebuchadnezzar. 29 At the end of twelve months he walked in the palace of the kingdom of Babylon. 30 The king spake, and said, Is not this great Babylon, that I have built for the house of the kingdom by the might of my power, and for the honour of my majesty? 31 While the word *was* in the king's mouth, there fell a voice from heaven, saying, O king Nebuchadnezzar, to thee it is spoken; The kingdom is departed from thee. 32 And they shall drive thee from men, and thy dwelling shall be with the beasts of the field: they shall make thee to eat grass as oxen, and seven times shall pass over thee, until thou know that the most High ruleth in the kingdom of men, and giveth it to whomsoever he will. 33 The same hour was the thing fulfilled upon Nebuchadnezzar: and he was driven from men, and did eat grass as oxen, and his body was wet with the dew of heaven, till his hairs were grown like eagles' feathers, and his nails like birds' claws.

Daniel 5:30 In that night was Belshazzar the king of the Chaldeans slain.
