## **The Gift Of Diligent Leaders - Romans 12H**

- Ephesians 6:4 And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.
- 1 Corinthians 12 Referred to a similar chapter of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.
- 1 Corinthians 12:31 But covet earnestly the best gifts: and yet shew I unto you a more excellent way.
- John 16:23 And in that day you will ask Me nothing. Most assuredly, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in My Name He will give you.
- 1 Timothy 3:6 Not a novice, lest being lifted up with pride he fall into the condemnation of the devil.
- Romans 12:8 he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.
- Joshua 3:7 And the LORD said unto Joshua, This day will I begin to magnify thee in the sight of all Israel, that they may know that, as I was with Moses, so I will be with thee.
- Summarized the murmurings & complainings in the wilderness.
- Numbers 14:22 Because all those men which have seen My glory, and My miracles, which I did in Egypt and in the wilderness, and have tempted Me now these ten times, and have not hearkened to My voice;
- Exodus 32 Summarized of the golden calf sin & Moses interceding for them.
- Summarized of Jesus ministering to the people long times & praying at night to his Father.
- Hebrews 12:2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.
- John 21:21 Peter seeing him said to Jesus, Lord, and what shall this man do?
- 1 Samuel 2:29 Wherefore kick ye at My sacrifice and at Mine offering, which I have commanded in My habitation; & honour thy sons above Me, to make yourselves fat with the chiefest of all the offerings of Israel My people?
- Romans 14:12 So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God. Matthew 25 Summarized of the parable of the talents.

- 1 Thessalonians 5:12 And we urge you, brethren, to recognize those who labor among you, and are over <4291> you in the Lord and admonish you,
- 1 Timothy 3:4 one who rules <4291> his own house well, having *his* children

- in submission with all reverence 5 (for if a man does not know how to rule <4291> his own house, how will he take care of the church of God?);
- 1 Timothy 3:12 Let deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling <4291> *their* children and their own houses well.
- 1 Timothy 5:17 Let the elders who rule <4291> well be counted worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in the Word and doctrine.
- Jude 1:3 Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints.
- Proverbs 2:6 For the LORD giveth wisdom: out of his mouth cometh knowledge and understanding.
- 1 Kings 3:9 Give therefore thy servant an understanding heart to judge Thy people, that I may discern between good and bad: for who is able to judge this Thy so great a people?
- Titus 3:8 This is a faithful saying, and these things I want you to affirm constantly, that those who have believed in God should be careful to maintain <4291> good works. These things are good and profitable to men.
- Jeremiah 3:15 And I will give you pastors according to Mine heart, which shall feed you with knowledge and understanding.
- Jeremiah 23 & Ezekiel 34 Referred to bad examples of pastors.
- Numbers 11 Referred to Moses' 70 elders helping judge Israel.
- Acts 2:45 And sold their possessions and goods, and parted them to all men, as every man had need.
- Titus 3:14 And let our *people* also learn to maintain <4291> good works, to *meet* urgent needs, that they may not be unfruitful.
- 1 Timothy 5:9,10 Let not a widow be taken into the number under threescore years old, having been the wife of one man, 10 Well reported of for good works; if she have brought up children, if she have lodged strangers, if she have washed the saints' feet, if she have relieved the afflicted, if she have diligently followed every good work.
- Ephesians 4:28 Let him who stole steal no longer, but rather let him labor, working with his hands what is good, that he may have something to give him who has need.
- Strongs #4710 spoude spoo-day' AV-diligence 5, haste 2, business 1, care 1, forwardness 1, earnest care 1, carefulness 1; 12 1) haste, with haste 2) earnestness, diligence 2a) earnestness in accomplishing, promoting, or striving after anything 2b) to give all diligence, interest one's self most earnestly
- John 13:34,35 A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. 35 By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.

- Galatians 3:28 There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female: for ye are all one in Christ Jesus.
- Mark 6:25 Immediately she came in with haste <4710> to the king and asked, saying, I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter.
- Luke 3:19 But Herod the tetrarch, being reproved by him for Herodias his brother Philip's wife, and for all the evils which Herod had done,
- Luke 1:39 Now Mary arose in those days and went into the hill country with haste <4710>, to a city of Judah,
- Romans 12:8 he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.
- Romans 12:11 not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord;
- 2 Corinthians 2:12 Furthermore, when I came to Troas to preach Christ's gospel, and a door was opened unto me of the Lord,
- 2 Corinthians 7:11 For observe this very thing, that you sorrowed in a godly manner: What diligence <4710> it produced in you, what clearing of yourselves, what indignation, what fear, what vehement desire, what zeal, what vindication! In all things you proved yourselves to be clear in this matter.
- 2 Corinthians 7:10 For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death.
- 2 Chronicles 7:14 If My people, which are called by My Name, shall humble themselves, & pray, & seek My face, & turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.
- Leviticus 11:45 For I am the LORD that bringeth you up out of the land of Egypt, to be your God: ye shall therefore be Holy, for I am Holy.
- 1 John 3:3 And every man that hath this hope in Him purifieth himself, even as He is pure.
- John 2:17 And his disciples remembered that it was written, The zeal of thine house hath eaten me up.
- 2 Corinthians 7:12 Therefore, although I wrote to you, *I did* not *do it* for the sake of him who had done the wrong, nor for the sake of him who suffered wrong, but that our care for you in the sight of God might appear to you.
- Matthew 3:7 But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees come to his baptism, he said unto them, O generation of vipers, who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come? 8 Bring forth therefore fruits meet for repentance:
- 2 Corinthians 8:7 But as you abound in everything in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all diligence <4710>, and in your love for us *see* that you abound in this grace also.
- 2 Corinthians 12:8,9 For this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me. 9 And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for

my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

Luke 18 Referred to perisitance in prayer like the widow.

- 2 Corinthians 8:8 I speak not by commandment, but I am testing the sincerity of your love by the diligence <4710> of others.
- 1 Chronicles 12:16,17 And there came of the children of Benjamin and Judah to the hold unto David. 17 And David went out to meet them, and answered and said unto them, If ye be come peaceably unto me to help me, mine heart shall be knit unto you: but if ye be come to betray me to mine enemies, seeing there is no wrong in mine hands, the God of our fathers look thereon, and rebuke it.
- 2 Corinthians 8:16 But thanks *be* to God who puts the same earnest <4710> care for you into the heart of Titus.
- Hebrews 6:11 And we desire that each one of you show the same diligence <4710> to the full assurance of hope until the end,
- John 10:28,29 And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand. 29 My Father, which gave them me, is greater than all; and no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand.
- Hebrews 9:12 Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by His Own Blood He entered in once into the Holy Place, having obtained eternal redemption for us.
- 2 Peter 1:5 But also for this very reason, giving all diligence <4710>, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge,
- Galatians 5 Referred to the fruit of the Spirit.
- Romans 12:2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.
- Deuteronomy 6:7 "You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up.
- 2 Corinthians 5:14 For the love of Christ constraineth us; because we thus judge, that if one died for all, then were all dead:
- Jude 1:3 Beloved, while I was very diligent to write to you concerning our common salvation, I found it necessary to write to you exhorting you to contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints.
- 1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- Romans 12:8 Or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, let him do it with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that sheweth mercy, with cheerfulness.

- Titus 3:10 A man that is an heretick after the first and second admonition reject;
- Matthew 7:15 Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves.
- Mark 16:15-18 15 And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. 16 He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. 17 And these signs shall follow them that believe; In My Name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; 18 They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover.
- Luke 12:48 But he that knew not, and did commit things worthy of stripes, shall be beaten with few stripes. For unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required: and to whom men have committed much, of him they will ask the more.
- Matthew 9:38 Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest.

## **More Service Notes:**

1 Timothy 3:1-13 This is a faithful saying: If a man desires the position of a bishop, he desires a good work. 2 A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, temperate, sober-minded, of good behavior, hospitable, able to teach; 3 not given to wine, not violent, not greedy for money, but gentle, not quarrelsome, not covetous; 4 one who rules his own house well, having his children in submission with all reverence 5 (for if a man does not know how to rule his own house, how will he take care of the church of God?); 6 not a novice, lest being puffed up with pride he fall into the same condemnation as the devil. 7 Moreover he must have a good testimony among those who are outside, lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil. 8 Likewise deacons must be reverent, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy for money, 9 holding the mystery of the faith with a pure conscience. 10 But let these also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons, being *found* blameless. 11 Likewise their wives must be reverent, not slanderers, temperate, faithful in all things. 12 Let deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. 13 For those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a good standing and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus.
