Continuing Steadfastly In Prayer - Romans 12S

- **Exodus 20 Referred to the 10 Commandments.**
- Matthew 5 Referred to the Beatitudes.
- Romans 12:12 rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer;
- Galatians 5:22,23 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.
- Luke 11:1 Now it came to pass, as He was praying in a certain place, when He ceased, *that* one of His disciples said to Him, Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples.
- Luke 6:12 Now it came to pass in those days that He went out to the mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God.
- Matthew 10:37 He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me.
- Strongs #4342 proskartereo *pros-kar-ter-eh'-o* AV-continue 4, continue instant 1, continue steadfastly 1, attend continually 1, give (one's) self continually 1, wait on 1, wait on continually 1; 10 1) to adhere to one, be his adherent, to be devoted or constant to one 2) to be steadfastly attentive unto, to give unremitting care to a thing 3) to continue all the time in a place 4) to persevere and not to faint 5) to show one's self courageous for 6) to be in constant readiness for one, wait on constantly.
- Mark 14:38 Watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.
- Matthew 18:18 Assuredly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, & whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.
- Mark 16:17 And these signs will follow those who believe: In My Name they will cast out demons; they will speak with new tongues;
- Mark 3:9 So He told His disciples that a small boat should be kept ready <4342> for Him because of the multitude, lest they should crush Him.
- Matthew 16:19 And I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.
- Acts 1:14 These all continued <4342> with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women & Mary the mother of Jesus, & with His brothers.
- Acts 2:42 And they continued steadfastly <4342> in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers.

- Acts 2 Referred to the baptism of the Holy Spirit.
- Acts 2:46 So continuing <4342> daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart,
- Acts 6:4 but we will give ourselves continually <4342> to prayer and to the ministry of the Word.
- Ezra 7:10 For Ezra had prepared his heart to seek the law of the LORD, and to do *it*, and to teach in Israel statutes and judgments.
- Acts 8:13 Then Simon himself also believed; and when he was baptized he continued <4342> with Philip, and was amazed, seeing the miracles and signs which were done.
- Acts 8:9,12,13 But there was a certain man called Simon, who previously practiced sorcery in the city and astonished the people of Samaria, claiming that he was someone great, 12 But when they believed Philip as he preached the things concerning the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, both men and women were baptized. 13 Then Simon himself also believed; and when he was baptized he continued with Philip, and was amazed, seeing the miracles and signs which were done.
- Mark 16:16 He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned.
- Acts 8:21 You have neither part nor portion in this matter, for your heart is not right in the sight of God.
- Acts 10:7 And when the angel who spoke to him had departed, Cornelius called two of his household servants and a devout soldier from among those who waited <4342> on him continually <4342>.
- Romans 12:12 rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly <4342 in prayer;
- Romans 13:6 For because of this you also pay taxes, for they are God's ministers attending continually <4342> to this very thing.
- Colossians 4:2 Continue <4342> earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving;
- 1 Timothy 2:1.2 Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, 2 for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence.
- Strongs #4335 proseuche *pros-yoo-khay'* AV-prayer 36, pray earnestly+ 1; 37 1) prayer addressed to God 2) a place set apart or suited for the offering of prayer 2a) a synagogue 2b) a place in the open air where the Jews were wont to pray, outside the cities, where they had no synagogue 2b1) such places were situated upon the bank of a stream or the shore of a sea,

- where there was a supply of water for washing the hands before prayer.
- Matthew 17:21 However, this kind does not go out except by prayer <4335> and fasting. (Explained)
- Ephesians 6:11 Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.
- 2 Corinthians 10:4 (For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;)
- Ephesians 6:12 For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.
- Matthew 21:13 And He said to them, It is written, My house shall be called a house of prayer <4335>, but you have made it a den of thieves.
- Matthew 21:22 And whatever things you ask in prayer <4335>, believing, you will receive.
- Mark 9:29 So He said to them, This kind can come out by nothing but prayer <4335> and fasting.
- Mark 11:17 Then He taught, saying to them, Is it not written, My house shall be called a house of prayer <4335> for all nations? But you have made it a den of thieves.
- Luke 6:12 Now it came to pass in those days that He went out to the mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer <4335> to God.
- Referred to Reese Howels Intercessor.
- Luke 19:46 saying to them, It is written, My house is a house of prayer <4335>, but you have made it a den of thieves.
- Luke 22:45 When He rose up from prayer <4335>, and had come to His disciples, He found them sleeping from sorrow.
- Luke 21:36 Watch therefore, and pray always that you may be counted worthy to escape all these things that will come to pass, and to stand before the Son of Man.
- Acts 1:14 These all continued with one accord in prayer <4335> and supplication, with the women & Mary the mother of Jesus, & with His brothers.
- Acts 2:42 And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers <4335>.
- Acts 3:1 Now Peter and John went up together to the temple at the hour of prayer <4335>, the ninth *hour*.
- Acts 6:4 but we will give ourselves continually to prayer <4335> and to the ministry of the Word.
- Acts 10:4 And when he observed him, he was afraid, and said, What is it, lord? So he said to him, Your prayers <4335> and your alms have come up for a memorial before God.

- Acts 10:31 and said, Cornelius, your prayer <4335> has been heard, and your alms are remembered in the sight of God.
- Acts 12:5 Peter was therefore kept in prison, but constant prayer <4335> was offered to God for him by the church.
- Acts 16:13 And on the Sabbath day we went out of the city to the riverside, where prayer <4335> was customarily made; and we sat down and spoke to the women who met *there*.
- Luke 11:26 Then goeth he, and taketh to him seven other spirits more wicked than himself; and they enter in, and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first.
- Acts 16 Summarized the prision situation. V30,31 And brought them out, and said, Sirs, what must I do to be saved? 31 And they said, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house.
- Romans 1:9 For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of His Son, that without ceasing I make mention of you always in my prayers <4335>,
- Romans 12:12 rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer <4335>;
- Romans 15:30 Now I beg you, brethren, through the Lord Jesus Christ, and through the love of the Spirit, that you strive together with me in prayers <4335> to God for me,
- 1 Corinthians 7:5 Do not deprive one another except with consent for a time, that you may give yourselves to fasting and prayer <4335>; and come together again so that Satan does not tempt you because of your lack of self-control.
- Ephesians 1:16 do not cease to give thanks for you, making mention of you in my prayers <4335>:
- Ephesians 6:18 praying always with all prayer <4335> and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints
- Philippians 4:6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer <4335> and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God;
- 1 Thessalonians 5:18 In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.

- Colossians 4:2 Continue earnestly in prayer <4335>, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving;
- Colossians 4:12 Epaphras, who is *one* of you, a bondservant of Christ, greets you, always laboring fervently for you in prayers <4335>, that you may stand perfect and complete in all the will of God.
- 1 Thessalonians 1:2 We give thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers <4335>,
- 1 Timothy 2:1-4 Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers <4335>, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, 2 for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence. 3 For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, 4 who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.
- 1 Timothy 5:5 Now she who is really a widow, and left alone, trusts in God and continues in supplications and prayers <4335> night and day.
- Philemon 1:4 I thank my God, making mention of you always in my prayers <4335>,
- Philemon 1:22 But, meanwhile, also prepare a guest room for me, for I trust that through your prayers <4335> I shall be granted to you.
- James 5:17 Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed earnestly <4335> that it would not rain; and it did not rain on the land for three years and six months.
- 1 Kings 18 Referred to the shoot-out on Mount Carmel, & Elijah's praying for rain after.
- 1 Peter 3:7 Husbands, likewise, dwell with *them* with understanding, giving honor to the wife, as to the weaker vessel, and as *being* heirs together of the grace of life, that your prayers <4335> may not be hindered.
- 1 Peter 4:7 But the end of all things is at hand; therefore be serious and watchful in your prayers <4335>.
- Revelation 5:8 Now when He had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the 24 elders fell down before the Lamb, each having a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers <4335> of the saints.
- Revelation 8:3 Then another angel, having a golden censer, came and stood at the altar. He was given much incense, that he should offer *it* with the prayers <4335> of all the saints upon the golden altar which was before the throne.
- Revelation 8:4 And the smoke of the incense, with the prayers <4335> of the saints, ascended before God from the angel's hand.
- Colossians 4:1-6 Masters, give your bondservants (slaves) what is just and fair, knowing that you also have a Master in heaven. 2 Continue earnestly

in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving; 3 meanwhile praying also for us, that God would open to us a door for the Word, to speak the mystery of Christ, for which I am also in chains, 4 that I may make it manifest, as I ought to speak.

Luke 15:3 So He spoke this parable to them, saying:

Colossians 4:5,6 Walk in wisdom toward those *who are* outside, redeeming the time. 6 *Let* your speech always *be* with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one.

James 3 Referred to James' admonitions on the tongue.

Luke 11:1-13 Now it came to pass, as He was praying in a certain place, when He ceased, that one of His disciples said to Him, Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples. 2 So He said to them, When you pray, say: Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your Name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. 3 Give us day by day our daily bread. 4 And forgive us our sins, For we also forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And do not lead us into temptation, But deliver us from the evil one. 5 And He said to them, Which of you shall have a friend, and go to him at midnight and say to him, Friend, lend me three loaves; 6 for a friend of mine has come to me on his journey, and I have nothing to set before him; 7 and he will answer from within and say, Do not trouble me; the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot rise and give to you? 8 I say to you, though he will not rise and give to him because he is his friend, yet because of his persistence he will rise and give him as many as he needs. 9 So I say to you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. 10 For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. 11 If a son asks for bread from any father among you, will he give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will he give him a serpent instead of a fish? 12 Or if he asks for an egg, will he offer him a scorpion? 13 If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!
