## **Do All Things Without Disputings - Philippians 2D**

- Numbers 13&14 Referred to the evil report ill affecting the Israelites.
- Exodus 20 Referred to God giving the newly freed Israelited the 10 Commandments to guide them.
- Exodus 8:1 And the LORD spake unto Moses, Go unto Pharaoh, and say unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Let My people go, that they may serve Me.
- Matthew 5 Referred to Jesus giving the Beatitudes. V9 Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.
- **Exodus 20:14 Thou shalt not commit adultery.**
- Leviticus 18&20 Referred to God's expansion of His laws on morality.
- Acts 15:20 But that we write unto them, that they abstain from pollutions of idols, and from fornication, and from things strangled, and from blood.
- Philippians 2:14 Do all things without murmurings and disputings:
- Philippians 2:14 Do all things without complaining and disputing,
- Strongs #1261 dialogismos *dee-al-og-is-mos'* AV-thought 9, reasoning 1, imagination 1, doubtful 1, disputing 1, doubting 1; 14 1) the thinking of a man deliberating with himself 1a) a thought, inward reasoning 1b) purpose, design 2) a deliberating, questioning about what is true 2a) hesitation, doubting 2b) disputing, arguing.
- Isaiah 1:18 Come now, and let us reason together, saith the LORD: though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool.
- John 8:36 If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed.
- 1 Samuel 8:5,7 And said unto him, Behold, thou art old, and thy sons walk not in thy ways: now make us a king to judge us like all the nations. 7 And the LORD said unto Samuel, Hearken unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto thee: for they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected Me, that I should not reign over them.
- Joshua 3:7 And the LORD said unto Joshua, This day will I begin to magnify thee in the sight of all Israel, that they may know that, as I was with Moses, so I will be with thee.
- John 13:34,35 A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. 35 By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.
- Mark 16:17 And these signs shall follow them that believe; In My Name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues;
- Matthew 18:18 Verily I say unto you, Whatsoever ye shall bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever ye shall loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.
- Matthew 15:19 For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts <1261>, murders,

- adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies:
- Deuteronomy 6:5 And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.
- Leviticus 19:18 Thou shalt not avenge, nor bear any grudge against the children of thy people but thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself: I am the Lord.
- Mark 7:21,22 For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts <1261>, adulteries, fornications, murders, 22 Thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lasciviousness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness:
- 1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- Luke 2:35 (Yea, a sword shall pierce through thy own soul also,) that the thoughts <1261> of many hearts may be revealed.
- Luke 5:22 But when Jesus perceived their thoughts <1261>, He answering said unto them, What reason ye in your hearts?
- Matthew 5:28 But I say unto you, That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart.
- Luke 6:8 But He knew their thoughts <1261>, & said to the man which had the withered hand, Rise up, stand forth in the midst. He arose and stood forth.
- Matthew 26:42 He went away again the second time, and prayed, saying, O My Father, if this cup may not pass away from Me, except I drink it, Thy will be done.
- Job 1:21,22 Naked came I out of my mother's womb, & naked shall I return thither: the LORD gave, and the LORD hath taken away; blessed be the Name of the LORD. 22 In all this Job sinned not, nor charged God foolishly.
- Job 2:9 Then said his wife unto him, Dost thou still retain thine integrity? curse God, and die.
- Luke 9:46-48 Then there arose a reasoning <1261> among them, which of them should be greatest. 47 And Jesus, perceiving the thought <1261> of their heart, took a child, and set him by Him, 48 And said unto them, Whosoever shall receive this child in my name receiveth me: and whosoever shall receive me receiveth him that sent me: for he that is least among you all, the same shall be great.
- 2 Corinthians 12:10 Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong.
- Luke 24:38,39 He said unto them, Why are ye troubled? & why do thoughts <1261> arise in your hearts? 39 Behold My hands & My feet that it is I Myself: handle Me & see; for a spirit hath not flesh & bones as ye see Me have
- Romans 1:21 Because that, when they knew God, they glorified *Him* not as God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their imaginations <1261>, and their foolish heart was darkened.
- 1 Corinthians 2:16 For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he may

- instruct Him? But we have the mind of Christ.
- Romans 14:1 Him that is weak in the faith receive ye, *but* not to doubtful <1261> disputations<1253>.
- Strongs #1253 diakrisis dee-ak'-ree-sis AV-discerning 1, discern 1, disputation 1; 3 1) a distinguishing, discerning, judging.
- John 10:28,29 And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of My hand. 29 My Father, which gave them Me, is greater than all; and no man is able to pluck them out of My Father's hand.
- John 14:6 Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by Me.
- John 11:44 And he that was dead came forth, bound hand and foot with graveclothes: and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus saith unto them, Loose him, and let him go.
- Luke 19:46 Saying unto them, It is written, My house is the house of prayer: but ye have made it a den of thieves.
- 1 Corinthians 3:20 And again, The Lord knoweth the thoughts <1261> of the wise, that they are vain.
- Philippians 2:14 Do all things without murmurings and disputings <1261>:
- 1 Timothy 2:8 I will therefore that men pray every where, lifting up Holy hands, without wrath and doubting <1261>.
- Luke 18:11-14 The Pharisee stood & prayed thus with himself, God, I thank Thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. 12 I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess. 13 The publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner. 14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.
- James 2:4 Are ye not then partial in yourselves, and are become judges of evil thoughts <1261>?
- Job 23:7 There the righteous might <u>dispute</u> with Him; so should I be delivered for ever from my Judge.
- Strongs #03198 yakach *yaw-kahh'* AV-reprove 23, rebuke 12, correct 3, plead 3, reason 2, chasten 2, reprover + <u>0376</u> 2, appointed 1, arguing 1, misc 9; 59 1) to prove, decide, judge, rebuke, reprove, correct, be right 1a) (Hiphil) 1a1) to decide, judge 1a2) to adjudge, appoint 1a3) to show to be right, prove 1a4) to convince, convict 1a5) to reprove, chide 1a6) to correct, rebuke 1b) (Hophal) to be chastened 1c) (Niphal) to reason, reason together 1d) (Hithp) to argue.
- Mark 9:33,34 And He came to Capernaum: and being in the house He asked them, What was it that ye <u>disputed</u> among yourselves by the way? 34 But

- they held their peace: for by the way they had <u>disputed</u> among themselves, who *should be* the greatest.
- John 13:5 After that He poureth water into a bason, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith He was girded.
- John 19:30 When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, He said, It is finished: and He bowed His head, and gave up the ghost.
- Summarized of Salvation by Jesus.
- Acts 15:1 And certain men which came down from Judaea taught the brethren, and said, Except ye be circumcised after the manner of Moses, ye cannot be saved.
- Acts 6:9 Then there arose certain of the synagogue, which is called *the* synagogue of the Libertines, and Cyrenians, and Alexandrians, and of them of Cilicia and of Asia, <u>disputing</u> with Stephen.
- Acts 7:55,56 But he, being full of the Holy Ghost, looked up stedfastly into heaven, and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing on the right hand of God, 56 And said, Behold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of man standing on the right hand of God.
- Proverbs 26:4 Answer not a fool according to his folly, lest thou also be like unto him.
- Acts 9:29 And he spake boldly in the Name of the Lord Jesus, and <u>disputed</u> against the Grecians: but they went about to slay him.
- John 10:10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.
- Acts 15:2 When therefore Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and disputation with them, they determined that Paul and Barnabas, and certain other of them, should go up to Jerusalem unto the apostles and elders about this question.
- Acts 15:1 And certain men which came down from Judaea taught the brethren, and said, Except ye be circumcised after the manner of Moses, ye cannot be saved.
- Matthew 24:11 And many false prophets shall rise, and shall deceive many.
- 1 Corinthians 14:29 Let the prophets speak 2 or 3, and let the other judge.
- Acts 15:7 And when there had been much <u>disputing</u>, Peter rose up, and said unto them, Men *and* brethren, ye know how that a good while ago God made choice among us, that the Gentiles by my mouth should hear the Word of the gospel, and believe.
- Numbers 14:1 And all the congregation lifted up their voice, and cried; and the people wept that night.
- Acts 17:17 Therefore <u>disputed</u> he in the synagogue with the Jews, and with the devout persons, and in the market daily with them that met with him.
- Acts 17:23 For as I passed by, and beheld your devotions, I found an altar with

- this inscription, TO THE UNKNOWN GOD. Whom therefore ye ignorantly worship, him declare I unto you.
- Acts 17:30 And the times of this ignorance God winked at; but now commandeth all men every where to repent:
- Acts 19:8 And he went into the synagogue, and spake boldly for the space of 3 months, <u>disputing</u> & persuading the things concerning the kingdom of God.
- Matthew 7:21 Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of My Father which is in heaven.
- Luke 8 Referred to the seed (Word of God) sown & how it could grow.
- Acts 19:9 But when divers were hardened, and believed not, but spake evil of that way before the multitude, he departed from them, and separated the disciples, <u>disputing</u> daily in the school of one Tyrannus.
- Acts 24:12 And they neither found me in the temple <u>disputing</u> with any man, neither raising up the people, neither in the synagogues, nor in the city:
- 1 Corinthians 1:20 Where *is* the wise? where *is* the scribe? where *is* the disputer of this world? hath not God made foolish the wisdom of this world?
- 1 Timothy 6:5 Perverse <u>disputings</u> of men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth, supposing that gain is godliness: from such withdraw thyself.
- Strongs #3859 paradiatribe *par-ad-ee-at-ree-bay'* AV-perverse disputing 1; 1) useless occupation, empty business, misemployment.
- Strongs #4802 suzeteo *sood-zay-teh'-o* AV-question with 2, question 2, question one with another 1, enquire 1, dispute with 1, dispute 1, reason together 1, reason 1; 10 1) to seek or examine together 2) in the NT to discuss, dispute, question.
- Matthew 7:15 Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves.
- Titus 3:10 A man that is an heretick after the first and second admonition reject;
- 2 Corinthians 13:5 Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates?
- Jude 1:9 (AV) Yet Michael the archangel, when contending with the devil he <u>disputed</u> about the body of Moses, durst not bring against him a railing accusation, but said, The Lord rebuke thee.
- Jude 1:9 (NKJV) Yet Michael the archangel, in contending with the devil, when he disputed about the body of Moses, dared not bring against him a reviling accusation, but said, The Lord rebuke you!
- 1 John 2:23 Whosoever denieth the Son, the same hath not the Father: but he that acknowledgeth the Son hath the Father also.
